



Using Service Tracker with your students and teachers

Service Tracker allows your students to easily plan, participate and reflect on their service learning experiences. For teachers, Service Tracker provides an easy way to track and report on student service learning experiences.

Here are some suggestions for how you can incorporate the use of Service Tracker to enhance teaching and learning at your school.

Start of the year/term/ semester

Take students through the registration process to get them set up with Service Tracker. Explain that Service Tracker will be how they record all their service learning experiences.

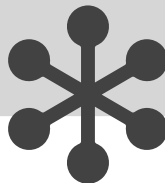
Portfolios

Students can export one, some or all of their service learning experiences to include in a portfolio, showcasing their development as a global citizen



Variety in Service Learning

Challenge students to identify and participate in service learning experiences in each of the different categories; direct service, indirect service, research and advocacy.



CAS requirements

Service Tracker provides a central place for students to easily store all actions and experiences related to service. Supervisors can keep track of student progress and use the data to gain feedback on the school's service learning programme

Showcase a project

Teachers can review all student projects and choose several to share with a wider audience during student celebration events, in school newsletters or on the school website.

Prepare for programme evaluation

Coordinators can include evidence from Service Tracker to show the impact of the school service learning programme as required in authorisation or evaluation visits.
